





## Music at 11 . . .

This morning's opening hymn is very familiar and its focus is praise to Jesus Christ. "When Morning Gilds the Skies" comes from 19th centrury Germany and the text is anonymous. The source is the "Katholisches Gesangbuch" of 1828. It is a hymn of praise - not a morning hymn. Any time is the right time to praise Christ. The original text had 14 verses, and over the years hymnal editors have made different choices, which creates slightly different versions in various hymnals. Joseph Barnby composed the tune Laudes Domini specifically for this text, and has helped to make this hymn popular with its final phrase exclaiming: "May Jesus Christ be praised."

Our second hymn this morning "Be Thou My Vision is also a hymn text that comes to us from that popular author "Anonymous." We live in a time when "now" is very important and it is helpful to sing hymns that remind us that throughout the ages the church has produced great ideas which are still valid and useful today. The text was written sometime around the 8th century and has become popular since the early 20th century when it was wedded to the tune "Slane" with its ABCD musical form. Each line is different!

England in the 19th century was famous for its choral societies. A fact that is still true to some degree today. "Savior, again to Thy dear name we raise" was written for an 1866 choral festival. As a closing hymn it is a prayer for the peace of God - on our way home, through the night, and at the end of our earthly life.





#### Can Tabs Make a Difference!

By saving the tabs on aluminum cans, you can help our environment and help families in need. The Ronald McDonald House helps families with seriously ill children who are receiving medical treatment far from home by providing food, housing, and so much more. The Ronald McDonald House raises charitable revenue by recycling aluminum can tabs. Can tabs have significant value in the recycling industry, representing the purest form of aluminum. The aluminum that is donated to the Ronald McDonald House is taken to a local recycling station where it is weighed and cashed in by the pound. The money netted is used to assist the Ronald McDonald House with operational expenses such as household supplies.

Please prayerfully consider saving aluminum can tabs and dropping them off at church. Collection tubs will be available in the Stainton Room and other locations

around the church. The Southard Family, who were recently guests at the Philadelphia Ronald McDonald House while their son Richard was receiving medical treatment, will collect the can tabs on an ongoing basis.
