





Music at 11...

This mornings opening hymn "Christ for the World We Sing" comes from a group of hymns written in the United States and Great Britain from the mid 19th to the early 20th centuries that were devoted to Christian missionary work. This hymn captures the zeal and the fervor of the time. They are sung responses to the Great Commission: Matthew 28: 16-20. These hymns present Christ as the great monarch who claims all earth as his domain. This body of hymnody was very powerful and the origin of this hymn can be found at a YMCA convention in Cleveland Ohio in 1869!

"Hope of the World, Thou Christ of great compassion" was written by Georgia Harkness who was a noted theologian of the 20th century. (1891-1974) The text was the winning hymn in the 1953 Hymn Society of Ámerica search for new texts on the theme "Jesus Christ, Hope of the World." This was the theme of the 1954 World Council of Churches Assembly in Evanston Illinois. Since that time it has been included in every major hymnal that has been published. There is hope for the world!

With heavy Rockefeller financial support, Riverside Church in New York City was built for Harry Emerson Fosdick one of America's foremost preachers. The church is non-denominational and opened in 1930. It was a grand occasion which invited self congratulation and more than a little pride. Fosdick looked forward to the date with enthusiasm and also humility as well as apprehension. To mark the occasion he wrote this hymn at his summer home in Booth Bay Harbor, Maine, with its call to face the call of Christ to be disciples, and to pray for wisdom and courage to face the hour rather than glory in it.

Can Tabs Make a Difference!

By saving the tabs on aluminum cans, you can help our environment and help families in need. The Ronald McDonald House helps families with seriously ill children who are receiving medical treatment far from home by providing food, housing, and so much more. The Ronald McDonald House raises charitable revenue by recycling aluminum can tabs. Can tabs have significant value in the recycling industry, representing the purest form of aluminum. The aluminum that is donated to the Ronald McDonald House is taken to a local recycling station where it is weighed and cashed in by the pound. The money netted is used to assist the Ronald McDonald House with operational expenses such as household supplies.

Please prayerfully consider saving aluminum can tabs and dropping them off at church. Collection tubs will be available in the Stainton Room and other locations around the church. The Southard Family, who were recently guests at the Philadelphia Ronald McDonald House while their son Richard was receiving medical treatment, will collect the can tabs on an ongoing basis.
